PhD in Education

The School of Education, located at Hattiban, Lalitpur, is one of the seven Schools of Kathmandu University. It was established in 1997 to contribute to enhancing the quality of education in the country. Its first academic programs were initiated in 1998 with MPhil and PhD programs in Educational Leadership. In the succeeding years, the School extended its academic activities by launching new inter/ multidisciplinary programs. At present, the School runs Bachelor, Post-Graduate Diploma, Master, Graduate Diploma in Higher Education, Master of Philosophy, and Doctoral programs.

The PhD Programs of KUSOED are highly acclaimed for producing educational experts capable of creating discourses on evolving educational and development-related issues and imparting analytical and research skills to explore the deeper layers of meaning, thereby developing next-generation leaders for transforming educational systems and perspectives. Duration

Full-time PhD students are expected to complete their research in 3 years. Part-time students can submit their research work after 4 years. The maximum duration for the completion of the requirements for the degree is 6 years for full time students, and 8 years for part-time students. Research publications in the relevant field of study is preferrable.

Program Outcomes

After successful completion of PhD in the School of Education, graduates are expected to:

- identify research issue(s) and to develop viable research design as per the ethos of paradigm(s), methodologies and methods employed in the research;
- develop sound understanding of the major areas, focus, and contours of local, regional, and international research in the respective research areas;
- enhance capacity for critical assessment of relevant scholarly literature in their field of study;
- design, implement and evaluate educational programs for the concerned community of practice;
- showcase well-developed, flexible problem-solving abilities (skills, knowledge, and attitudes) appropriate to the area of study;
- cultivate the ethos of life-long learning in their personal and professional contexts;
- accomplish independent research/inquiry in education-related issues in general and their specializations in particular.

Application Requirements

- Completion of the application form;
- Copies of credentials, a copy of the curriculum vitae, and reference letters;
- A fully developed research concept note of around 5000 words (written in English);
- The Research Committee evaluates the concept note and makes the final decision.
- The Research Committee considers the following for evaluation:
 - Writing ability [written test]
 - Interview
 - A sample research paper on a relevant subject (published or not published)
 - Research proposal
 - Past academic records
 - Relevant work experience (if any)

Note: The Research Committee of the School of Education reserves the right to select (or otherwise) scholars for PhD programs based on their scholarly merits. Applicants unable to demonstrate adequate knowledge and academic skills in the chosen areas will not be selected.



Pathway

The following pathway is suggested for the successful completion of the program in the case of fulltime students:

- 1) Demonstration of knowledge and skills necessary to conceptualize a research project by completing the research methodology-related courses (semester one);
- Demonstration of the ability to conceive and plan a closely defined research topic/agenda by presenting the research proposal to the Research Committee (between the first semester and the middle of the second semester);
- Demonstration of adequate knowledge of research methodologies and relevant literature by satisfactorily completing the qualifying assessment with two papers, one on methods and another on thematic areas (by the end of semester three);
- 4) Research fieldwork (after the completion of two qualifying papers);
- 5) Publication of two articles in peer-reviewed journals and participation in two relevant conferences (during the time of the study);
- 6) Submission of the written thesis;
- 7) Internal and external reviews of the thesis;
- 8) Viva voce.

The pathway for part-time students will be according to the KU regulations.

Evaluation of the Thesis

The thesis evaluation criteria will be as specified in the Research Guidelines for PhD developed by/for Kathmandu University School of Education.


